MR. BOB CLENDENIN...THANK YOU AND GOODBYE, MR. C

When Bob Clendenin's son Carter Clendenin asked me to speak at his funeral, there was no way I could say no. To pay my last respects to the finest boss anyone could have was an honor.


If you could write a playbook on what makes for a great principal, all you'd need to do is go back in time and do what he did. He was a master at leadership. He set the good example, followed the rules, and he expected everyone else to do the same. If you were on time, on task, and where you were supposed to be, you could get along great with Mr. C. He was principal at Page for 21 years, 1970-1991. During his tenure, he led Page to excellence in academics, athletics, and school spirit.

Often the last place you'd find Mr. C was in his office. And you would almost always find him sporting his Red Page Blazer! Visibility and interaction with staff and students were par for the course. You never knew when you were going to see him coming around the next corner, so it paid to stay in line. He didn't like excuses, and if you messed up, you were going to hear it. One day, as I was passing through the office, he said, "Coach, you missed the staff meeting." I was a bit taken aback, then said, "You're right, Mr. C. I plain forgot!" With that he thought for a minute, then said, "Don't let it happen again." I was excused, but I didn't miss another staff meeting!

Mr. C formed the Red Alert Team made of other coaches and me, and I had a Red Alert Button in my office. When Mr. C felt the need for more vigilance, he'd press that button and I'd notify my coaches. We'd go to our stations

scattered throughout the school. We weren't policemen. He just wanted students to understand that we were

in charge and they would act with self-discipline.

He was a funny guy with a great sense of humor. While he believed in discipline, he also believed in having a good time. He was Page's biggest cheerleader. Back in 1980, the Friday morning we were heading to Jacksonville to play for the

first time ever in a state championship, Mr. C called me and told me he wanted me to have all of the team lined up in the gym in numerical order. He wanted to have a pep rally. Now I had a lot on my mind, making sure I had everything in order before I put my guys on those buses, and I told Mr. C, "I really don't need this. I don't need anybody 'rallying my pep' before we leave." He simply said, "I don't think you heard me. I'll see you at 8:30." So I proceeded to do as I was

told. And we had the best pep rally ever, with him leading the way. And we came home with Page's first state football championship!

Although he couldn't condone certain antics that took place, you couldn't miss the sparkle in his eye when before the Page-Grimsley football game, the Pirate Ship was found in a ditch in east Greensboro. Or when the old fire engine that was owned by a Page parent was driven through the Grimsley campus with bells, whistles, and lights going.

Follow his orders, and Mr. C always had your back. In the early '70's, there were occasional incidents between teams after games. So in order to be sure nothing of this sort occurred, before the Smith game he instructed me get my players off the field as soon as the game was over. I shook hands with the coaches, then sent my team to the locker room, as Mr. C had requested. The next morning, the newspaper said I had been rude and showed bad sportsmanship. Mr. C's response? "I'll take care of it."

Mr. C had a huge heart. If you "did the right thing," you could count on his support. One of the things he'd throw out to teachers from time to time was "Go find an underdog you can help today." And they often did. It made us want to go out of our way to seek out someone who needed an extra lift. The Page Family was central to his being.

At one time, I was both Athletic Director and Football Coach. In the fall of1979, with the arrival of a new superintendent, a new policy was installed in the school system that you couldn't be both an AD and a coach. So Mr. C. asked me to decide which I wanted to be. I asked him to give me two weeks. A week later he called me and said, "Meet me halfway," which was in the breezeway halfway between our offices. He said, "Coach, I may lose you, but I'm putting you in the classroom, and you're going to be the football coach." I had such great respect for him that I was going to do what he wanted me to do. Fortunately, being the Page Football Coach was exactly

what I wanted. He saw great potential in me as a football coach, and I worked to live up to his expectation.

Mr. Bob Clendenin was hard. He was fair. He was the best. He was not my buddy, but he was my friend. Thank you, Mr. C, for your great leadership.

Coach Kirby led Page on the gridiron for 23 years. During that time, his teams won many games and many conference championships. He took his team to five State Championship games, winning State Titles in 1980, 1983, and 1985; losing in 1982; and tying in 1984.

BARRY DOOLEY, COUNSELOR EMERITUS EXTRAORDINAIRE

After forty years in the Guilford County school system, Barry Dooley, a beloved senior counselor at Page, is retiring, leaving an absence that will be hard, if not impossible, to fill.

Cameron Putnam, a Class of 2016 alum headed to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, commented, "It's easy to say that a lot of seniors are deeply appreciative of Mr. Dooley's commitment to helping us achieve our goals of graduating and going to college. No matter who you are or what your problem was, Mr. Dooley made sure to take time out of his busy day to help in any way he could."

You would think that after spending nearly half of a decade working as a middle school and then high school counselor with such commitment and passion, Dooley would have always wanted to be a part of counseling. However, that was not necessarily the case. He shares, "I had planned to be a teacher. Then during my time at West Virginia University, I decided that I wanted to work at the college level." When he saw the opportunity in being a college counselor, he decided to pursue his Masters in Counseling.





Then his interests shifted once again. After he was required to do a field experience in a different area, he chose

elementary education. Soon, he fell in love with counseling those students. So upon receiving his Masters in Counseling in 1976 from WVU and being offered a job at Mendenhall Junior High School, he made the move to Greensboro. He was at Mendenhall for ten years. Then in 1986, when ninth grade moved up to Page High from Mendenhall Junior High School, he moved right up with it.

It was that move that began his thirty-year run at Page. He has remained a beloved counselor and legendary figure at Page, helping thousands of seniors from 1986 to 2016 find their best paths to success. In that time he has seen the school change, not only in regards to the edifice or the size of the ever-growing student body but also in regards to the student body itself. He comments, "Teenagers are teenagers, but I think teenagers now move at a faster pace, are more stressed, and, I guess are more worldly, than they used to be, which is good and bad, I think." Either way, Dooley has been able to maintain that personal connection with each and every one of his students, something that seems to be so rare in most human interaction today.

"I would say that he was the most caring person I met in all my time at Page," remarked Class of 2016 graduate Susannah Townes, who will be attending the University of Virginia next fall. "Any student could come to him at any time with any problem. Not only would he almost always be able to fix it, but also just by a quick conversation he could reassure you that everything would be ok. Every interaction he had with the students at Page added a sense of community and trust to our school."

Page's sense of community, which Dooley undoubtedly contributed to, also stuck out to him. "You know, I love Page, I love the community, I love what I do here. It's the best school in the county." These are fighting words, especially considering that his wife and daughters are Grimsley graduates. But Dooley holds steadfast. "It's a great, great school..."

For Dooley, the most rewarding experience of his job is "just seeing a student who has struggled and then all of a sudden a light turns on and he ends up graduating or going to college... going from hopeless to hopeful."

As for his hopes for retirement, he is looking to relax a bit and maybe do some volunteer work. However, he could definitely see himself getting back into the school system in some way. "I'm going to take some time and try to enjoy it," he said, with a smile. Anyone involved in the Page community knows that after all he has done for Page, its community, and its students, he certainly deserves to enjoy himself in retirement.

Page Men's Tennis started the 2016 season expecting to win a state championship. And win it, they did! Losing last year in the state championship title game, all returned this year, determined to win the title.




