PAGE SENIORS EARN \$21,711,352 IN SCHOLARSHIPS!!!

The Class of 2014 has earned the highest scholarship totals in the history of Page, which is also the highest total for all of Guilford County Schools! Page had 32 students who earned over \$100,000 each in academic scholarships, and three that earned over \$100,000 in athletic scholarships!

The breakdown is as follows: Academic \$9.3 million, Athletic \$9.7 million, Grants and Work Study \$2.1 million, for a combined total of \$21,711,352 in financial assistance to succeed at the next level of education. This total includes many "full academic rides" to colleges such as Vanderbilt, Clemson, North Carolina A&T, and Winston-Salem State, to name a few. Our three National Merit Finalists received many offers of full tuition from colleges all over the country. We had a winner of the prestigious Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship to Chapel Hill, as well as an Army ROTC scholarship to UNC Charlotte. Our outstanding athletic program was also recognized nationally, with many "full-ride" offers to Division 1 schools, including Florida State Football and Vanderbilt Women's Basketball.



I definitely intend to represent Page well at ECU in this next chapter in my life. And since I am attending ECU, it's safe to say that I am all in for being a "Pirate for life"!



FORMER MUSIC TEACHERS NAMED TO NORTH CAROLINA MUSIC EDUCATORS HALL OF FAME

SAM DOYLE, CHARLES MURPH, AND FORREST MUNDEN were inducted into the NCMEA Hall of Fame in February and May of 2014 – Doyle in the Choral Section, Murph and Munden in the Bandmasters. The fact that they all have Page ties with their time at Page overlapping makes this honor even more significant. Mr. Munden was assistant band director at Page when Mr. Doyle arrived in 1972. Mr. Murph, an assistant director at Grimsley, later became Page’s band director. Eventually, Mr. Munden moved to Grimsley until his retirement in 1999.



SAM DOYLE came to the Greensboro Public Schools soon after graduating from UNCG in 1969 – working at Grimsley and Dudley before coming to Page in 1972 – then retired from Page in 1998. During the course of his 26 years at Page, Mr. Doyle’s choruses performed locally and internationally, including opening day at the New Orleans World’s Fair; as the US representative at the Kennedy International Youth Choral Festival at the Kennedy Center, Washington, DC; while touring England, Scotland, and Wales; and at an international music conference in London, Ontario. He and his choruses have received many awards and accolades. He has served on local and state music boards and was twice selected as *Teacher of the Year* for the Greensboro Public Schools.

Since retiring from Page, Mr. Doyle has taught part-time at Weaver Academy, is very active in music and education organizations, works at music festivals as a clinician, and is presently serving as the Assistant Director of the Choral Society of Greensboro. He has been the choirmaster at St. Francis Episcopal Church for the last 35 years.

CHARLES MURPH taught in the Greensboro City School from 1964-1990, serving as band director at Mendenhall Middle and Page High Schools. Under his direction, the Page Band performed at the National Music Conventions in Nashville, Tennessee, and in Louisville Kentucky.

He is a member of several music educators’ organizations and has held positions within those. Mr. Murph has served as a clinician for UNCG summer camp and has directed the Greensboro Concert Band. He continues to serve music education by repairing band instruments I think it would be appropriate to add that the

FOREST MUNDEN taught band in NC for 34 years before retiring in 1999, later returning to teach part-time in Winston-Salem/ Forsyth Schools. Mr. Munden’s bands consistently performed at the highest level, receiving Superior Ratings. He has served on music boards and been published in music journals.

It is families like the Washburns and companies like Morrisette Paper that help Page become a better place for our students to learn. The generosity of time and resources from Morrisette Paper





PHS-SAC

Walter Hines Page High School opened in September 1958 with 500+ students and about 30 staff members. It has grown to a population of 2000+ students and 140+ staff members. In 1962 the auditorium was built, and G-Wing was added the next year. The Auxiliary Gym was added in 1976. In 2004-05, A-Wing and B-Wing were extended and connected, adding MUCH-needed classroom space, and the Media Center was enlarged. Air conditioning was added to areas that did not have it (which, in fact, were many areas). *The cafeteria, auditorium, and office space have basically remained the same since construction.* On a sidebar, Page is the only county high school that is projected to have an increase in student population over the next ten years.

While some improvements/additions have been made through the years, Page is in dire need of a *new or renovated auditorium, a larger cafeteria, more office space, additional classrooms, more storage, and additional AND up-to-code bathrooms.* In light of this, a **Page High School – Strategic Action Committee** has been formed. This committee (through our Alumni and Friends Association) is raising \$10,000 to pay for a comprehensive architectural plan. This plan will study the buildings on campus and set forth a plan that will give us needed space for an optimal learning environment for Page students. The plan will assess costs of construction and long-term costs of heating/cooling/etc. It may include renovation, enlarging, or razing present structures.

Once the plan is in place, we will take it to the School Board, asking how we can partner together and bring the Page facilities to the level our students deserve. If you can join our committee or be of service in any way, please contact Chairperson Annie B. Trent at trents5@triad.rr.com.
