I further realized the awesome responsibility on those of us charged with continuing to uphold the excellence and values of the past as we move into the future.

As we reflect on the year, we are so pleased and proud to report many notable accomplishments of our students:

- A Morehead-Cain Scholarship recipient
- A National Merit Scholarship recipient (3 finalists)
- \$7.7 million in scholarship money – the largest amount awarded in Page's history
- 16 varsity teams recognized as Scholar-Athlete Teams (a cumulative 3.1 or better on a 4.0 scale)

- Full authorization of the IB program

Sophie Kruij is headed to the University of Oregon. A Page Playmaker for four years, she plans to pursue Theater Arts and Communications. Sophie was active in the Mock Trial Competition, Operation Smile, the Gay/Straight Alliance, Creative Writing Club, and the Photography Club at Page. In the Greensboro community, she volunteers her time with Urban Ministries, the Natural Science Center, and the Community Theatre of Greensboro. From Sophie's essay...*I'm glad I can*

With a mother who attended the School of Pharmacy at UNC-Chapel Hill and a father who received his undergraduate and medical degrees from Carolina, it is no wonder that **Christina Olson** would also choose UNC. There is one huge difference, and that is that Christina is going as a recipient of the prestigious Morehead-Cain Scholarship! Providing for tuition, books, and all the normal expenses of a college education, the Morehead-Cain Scholarship also provides an enrichment experience that is second to none.

In fact, as this story is being written, Christina is in Wyoming on a backpacking-hiking trip, provided for all first year scholarship winners. Enrichment experiences such as this are a way to embrace a culture of challenges, exploring limits, and stretching beyond comfort zones.

Christina is no stranger to leadership, scholarship, or physical rigor. At Page High School, Christina lettered in Cross-Country and Soccer, while holding leadership positions in Student Council and The National Honor Society. She was a co-founder of the **Random Acts of Community Kindness**, or "RACK," as it is known on campus. This serves as a conduit for students to perform community service in a variety of ways, as a group. As for academics, Christina credits the Advanced Placement courses she took at Page for allowing her to have choices when she arrives in Chapel Hill. Being able to place out of some required first year classes will help propel the Page Pirate into more complex areas of study at a much faster clip.

Over the years, many Page Alumni have won the Morehead Scholarship, but Christina breaks an almost ten-year drought for Page students. Currently Christina plans to focus on double majoring in Spanish and International Studies with an emphasis on public health issues. The Morehead-Cain Scholarship promises access to "limitless academic and professional opportunity," and Page's own Christina Olson will be there to take advantage of those wonderful opportunities. FOUR TEACHER SCHOLARSHIPS

This year the Page Alumni and Friends Association granted four \$250 Continuing Education Scholarships to four deserving Page teachers.

Richard Cartwright has taught eight of his fifteen years at Page. This summer he will be going to the University of Kentucky to a *conventiculum*, an Oral Latin Convention, which is an eight-day, full-immersion Latin-speaking experience. As “a strong advocate for the use of oral Latin in the high school classroom,” he is looking forward to working with two of the most notable Latin speakers in the world, Dr. Terrence Tunberg and Dr. Milena Minkova.

Elizabeth Hackney came to Page out of college and has taught for five years. She is working on a Masters in English Education at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, taking classes that will positively impact the teaching of her AP and IB courses. She says her students “would agree that my work as a student helps keep me grounded as I realize the trials they go through every day.”

Brandon Antonio Mack, having served three of his seven teaching years at Page, is pursuing a Master’s Degree in Mathematics Education at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical University. He strongly believes “an educator must not just provide learners with information, but also with the tools to develop, navigate, and explore on their own.” He will be helping fill the void created by retiring teacher Wally Midkiff and says he “has big shoes to fill!”

Teresa L. McNeill, having taught six of her 24 years at Page, is pursuing an Educational Specialist Master’s degree. She has taught math and is presently the ESL (English as a Second Language) coordinator. She has been instrumental in helping ESL students realize academic success and says, “The ESL population is impacting our EOC scores positively due to our sheltered instruction classes and alternative assessments.”

The most prominent memory of my time at Page was of Principal Luther Medlin bringing everyone together, stressing the importance of creating the organizations and programs necessary to achieve accreditation in the first year. It was his goal, and he made it our goal. Under his leadership—and with the dedication of the teachers, administrative staff, and the students—the goal was achieved.

Luther Medlin set high standards for Page from the beginning, and we have all benefited. It was a privilege to have known him while at Page and for many years after. My wife was Helen Medlin’s secretary for a few years at Claxton Elementary, and we maintained friendship with Dr. Medlin until his passing a few years ago and with Helen Medlin now.

Page was a new beginning, particularly for the Senior Class of 1959. We were a small group who had left GHS and for

the most part had all known each other and been in school together since first grade. For the short time that we were at Page, I surmised that we all enjoyed the warmth and participation afforded by a smaller school.

May 31 of this year I retired after 36 years of selling textiles to the furniture industry. My wife Carol and I have moved to coastal North Carolina to ponder the sound of the surf, play golf, and devote ourselves to our two-year-old grandson.

A REAL HERO

One of the benefits of moving back to your hometown is meeting fellow Page Alumni in the community. I have run across former Pirates at the grocery store, Lowe's, the insurance agency, UPS, my church, and Time Warner Cable. Pirates seem to be everywhere! Of all the alumni encounters I've had since I moved home in 1994, none has made me as proud to be a Page Pirate as the day I met Darnell Brame.

My mother had become very involved with a new non-profit agency, the Barnabas Network. Barnabas is designed to provide their clients necessary furnishings to help make a home for families in need. In the spring of 2007, I was asked to help rearrange collected furniture in a new section of the warehouse, space that is donated by a generous, anonymous Page alum. After we had moved into the new space, I was paired with Darnell to go pick up some items that had been donated for the cause.

As we were leaving the warehouse, Darnell and I started a conversation, looking for a bond. We realized we were both Page Pirates. He asked when I graduated, and I told him '86. He said, "So did my brother. Do you remember Wayne Brame?" I had a flashback like the ones you see in a movie, and I replied, "Do I remember him? You mean the hero of the Page Pirate football team of 1985?"

In case you were not following Page football in the mid-80's – and it was hard not to, since they were continuously nationally ranked in the top twenty – a 34-game win streak was on the line, and so was a third straight football championship. Sanford had blocked a punt deep in Page territory, and they were setting up for a simple 20-yard field goal to win the game and crush all of our dreams. Simple? Yeah, right!!!

A lightning-quick sophomore, Tripp Welborne, broke through the line to block the kick. The ball took one bounce into the arms of Wayne Brame, who ran 75 yards for the winning touchdown (26-20) to continue the Page winning tradition. Darnell and I recalled the play together, both remembering every detail. He said with a distant but proud expression, "Yeah, everyone always remembers Wayne. Wayne was everyone's hero."

Well, there are at least two heroes in the Brame family. The truth is that Barnabas Network would not be where it is today if not for Darnell's dedication. He was providing furniture for families in need before the Barnabas Network was organized.

He would drive around Greensboro, looking for items left on the curb that he felt some family could use. He'd bring the furnishings back to his house, set them up, and have "customers" come and shop. When I asked Darnell if they paid, he just chuckled to himself and shook his head, saying that they didn't have the money to buy. I asked why he went to these great lengths to do this after a long night of the third shift at Cone Mills where he serves as a supervisor. He told me that some people just need a little help.

The hundreds of hours Darnell has given back to society, to people he doesn't even know, is amazing. Barnabas now has a paid part-time position for Darnell, and he still keeps his position at Cone Mills. My mother, Whimsey Wright, and Rosalyn Orr, the Barnabas Executive Director, both agree that Darnell is the heart of the organization. He kept the mission pumping during the early stages when Barnabas was on life support.

FROM PAGE TO PALESTINE

So how in the world did I end up in Palestine? While at Page from 1999 to 2003, I had no idea what I'd be doing at age 23. Nor could I have located Palestine on a map (it includes, of course, the lima bean-shaped territory east of Israel – the "West Bank" – and a small piece of land on the Mediterranean Sea called the Gaza Strip).



Aside from the physical act of submitting a job application to a West Bank high school, there was no singular event that got me here. Instead, it was a chain of events.

Perhaps the first link of that chain was when I rode a bus across Greensboro to Peeler Elementary School, a racially and socio-economically diverse magnet school in one of the city's poorer neighborhoods. It was there that I first made friends with people different from myself.

Another link was added after my sophomore year at Page. That summer I attended Anytown, a diversity and youth-leadership program for high school students. The experience was transforming; I returned to Page with a new set of eyes and a lower tolerance for intolerance. It also developed in me a curiosity about what's different – particularly outside our borders.

That curiosity was fed – and another link was added – with study-abroad programs in college. While at UNC-Chapel Hill, I traveled to Southeast Asia, to South America, and – perhaps most definitively – to the Middle East. I studied abroad in Jordan in 2005 and looked for ways to return to the region upon graduation in May 2007.

That brings us back to the beginning, the physical act of submitting a job application to a West Bank high school. Here at Ramallah Friends School, an American-owned Quaker school (www.palfriends.org), I teach English to Palestinian ninth and eleventh-graders in the International Baccalaureate Program (yes, the same as at Page).

The next time you're in the neighborhood, look me up. All are welcome. You now know you have a friend and fellow Page High alum in Palestine. I keep a blog at makingcoffee.blogspot.com and can be reached at stephen.lassiter@gmail.com.

FROM PAGE TO THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Students in the classroom often fail to see the connection between what they are learning and how it applies to their "real" lives of sports practice, rehearsals for plays, band practice, volunteering opportunities, boy scouts, and busy, busy social lives. It was true for me in high school, and it is true for the students I teach today.

It was not until I was in Mrs. Woodlief's Fast Forward English class during my senior year that I was able to see things a little bit differently. Among all of the creative (and demanding!) lessons that Mrs. Woodlief taught, there was one assignment that stood out from the rest: an observation paper. We were to go some place we had never been before and *observe*. We were to simply watch. And watch. And watch. Accompanying all of this watching were the pages of notes that turned into a tremendous paper full of revisions, tears, and sweat – and, in the end, something I was proud to call my own.



That was a turning point for my education. Somewhere in the back of my mind, that class taught me the power of reading and writing well. Now I am teaching English to grades 10-12 at King's Christian School in the Dominican Republic. Class sizes are small, with only 66 students in the entire school. There is an amazing spirit and joy of

Teachers, like students, come and go. Seldom do teachers come and stay as long as the four who are retiring from Page this year!

Gail Bentley has served Page as the Media Specialist for the last **13 years**. She has helped guide thousands of students through the stacks at Page.

Mrs. Bentley recalls the days when, during Spirit Week, Page students (in their cars) would “parade through” the Grimsley campus, and Grimsley would “parade by” our campus. As the “Media Specialist,” Paul Puryear would call on her to go out with the movie camera to film the Grimsley Parade at Page. She was then also called into duty to film Page’s parade at Grimsley! (This could have been an attempt to record the students’ creativity – or to have a record of “over-the-top” mischief!) No amount of pleading, “But, Paul, it’s dangerous out there!” would relieve her of her duties!

Ellen Freiberg, retiring after **29 years** at Page, was hired as a Testing Coordinator in 1979. She and Page Alumnus and former teacher, Lisa Comito ('73), were known as the Dynamic Duo. Mrs. Freiberg taught remedial English, then later switched to Spanish – a big surprise to those that didn’t realize Spanish was a primary area of expertise!

Mrs. Freiberg has taught many levels of Spanish, helping students learn to read and understand another language, and really celebrating when they learned to communicate verbally IN Spanish! But some of her favorite memories relate to “Spirit Week.” Students and teachers decorated rooms and halls, and the finished products were open to judging. As many students also embellished their cars in honor of Spirit Week, teachers would trek to the student parking lots in order to name the “Best Decorated Car.”

John Meyer is retiring from teaching after 34 years, the last **27 years** at Page. He has taught a vast array of courses, has been the AP Coordinator for many years, and this past year has served as the AP/IB Coordinator. He introduced

Mr. Meyer has MANY fond memories of Page. He recalls the spirited pep rallies led by Mr. Clendenin. He remembers the year (1997?) he took a group to the Model UN in Georgetown. His Page group represented Yugoslavia and debated the group representing Israel (who had Presidential daughter Amy

Carter in its group). There was one year he had a major complaint with scheduling – the year his AP European History class followed Mr. Midkiff’s AP Calculus class – and his students would come in dragging and drained!

Wally Midkiff came to Page in 1965 and has taught almost every math course imaginable in his **36 years** here. He has taken two “sabbaticals” since 1965, coming back each time with a renewed energy for helping his students REALLY understand mathematical concepts. Sometimes students would confuse his demand for excellence as torture.....until they got to college and realized how much they had learned under his guidance!

Mr. Midkiff met his wife Ellen at Page (who taught English at Page for 28 years), and they were married in 1979. *The Buccaneer* was dedicated to this husband-wife duo in 1982. There is one very unique aspect of Mr. Midkiff’s tenure. He is the ONLY teacher who has taught under EVERY Page principal Page: Luther Medlin, Bob Newton, Bob Clendenin, Paul Puryear, Terry Worrell, Colette Love, Interim Jim Woody, and Marilyn Foley.

So, what are they going to do with all of their spare time? Gail is going to travel, read, and find another whippet. Ellen is going to travel, read, and speak LOTS of Spanish. John is going to sculpt, carve, and teach at UNCG and GC. Wally is going to devote more time to a’singin’ and a’pickin’ (his banjo and guitar).
